



Making On-Line Flash Cards With quizlet.com

Flash cards are a great way to get ready for tests and final exams. Now, you can make and store your flash cards on-line. There are many free flash card programs. One good one is <http://quizlet.com>

Getting started in quizlet:

1. On your Chromebook click on the left hand side grid for Apps.
2. Go to the Web App Store.
3. Type in the word *quizlet*
4. Click on the quizlet app and download it for free.
5. Do a quick registration by clicking on the google mail icon.
6. Quizlet will give you a user name and ask for your age and a password.
7. You can enter quizlet by the web address or by the App on the left of your Chromebook.

Creating your flash cards:

1. When in quizlet, click on **Create Set** in the menu bar.
2. Make a title, like *World Studies Final Review*
3. Then type in the **Terms** and the **Definitions** for what you are studying.
4. You can add as many terms and definitions as you want.
5. Click the **create button** in the lower right hand corner and you've made your stack of flashcards.
6. You can add or delete cards from your stack whenever you want.

Quizlet Has Lots of Ways to Study Your Flashcards:

1. Open your flash cards by clicking on the title of the stack you want to study.
2. Click on the **CARDS** icon on the left side of the screen.
3. Your term will appear; then click on the card to flip to the definition.
4. Use the arrow at the bottom or on your keyboard to go to the next card.
5. You can also turn on the **audio feature** if you want the term or definition spoken as you study.
6. Use **LEARN** and type in the term that goes with the definition.
7. Use **TEST** to have quizlet make multiple choice, fill-in, and true-false questions.
8. Use **SCATTER** to drag definitions to the terms.
9. Play **SPACE RACE** to see how quickly you can type in the term.
10. The **TOOLS** feature allows you to share your cards with a classmate or print.
